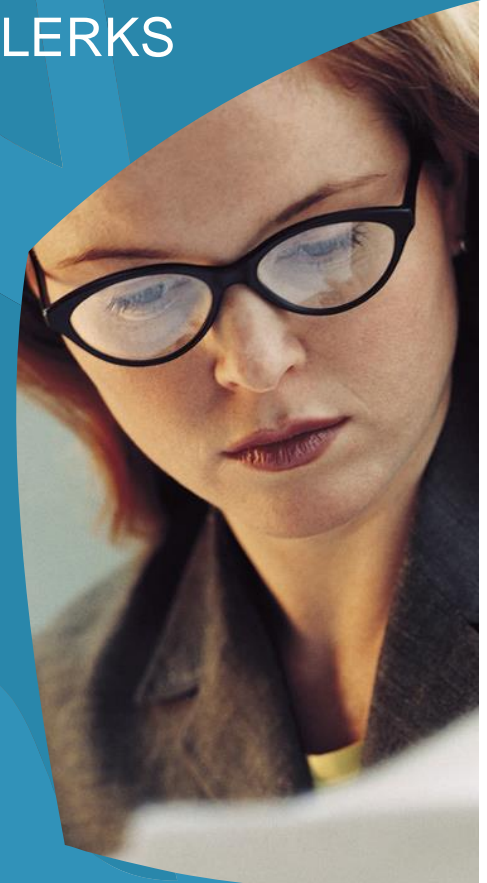

Association Information

"Learning from others" was the purpose stated on December 8, 1967, as 96 city and town clerks representing the six New England States met in Auburn, Massachusetts to organize the New England Association of City and Town Clerks. The new Association chose officers and adopted by-laws, with Harry W. Christensen, from Weymouth, MA serving as the first President.



NEACTC IS UNIQUE

It is the only regional association of its kind in the country, providing clerks from six states the ability to exchange ideas and work together towards unifying procedures. Our conference is held in the fall in the home state of the current President.

The conference is a 2 ½ day event, attended typically by 150 clerks from around New England, and features high-level quality speakers, many times from different parts of New England or the country. Points are awarded towards IIMC certification. It is, also, a great opportunity for Clerks with limited funds to participate in a New England level conference while we are in their home state.

WHAT IS IIMC CERTIFICATION?

A CMC (Certified Municipal Clerk) certification is a distinction granted by the International Institute of Municipal Clerks to Clerks who have completed three years of full attendance at a recognized Institute (such as NEMCI) and/or fulfilled other educational and non-educational requirements. You must also have been a member of IIMC for a minimum of two years to qualify for your CMC certification. The Academy offers an opportunity to pursue the MMC (Master Municipal Clerk) designation. NEACTC members are eligible for scholarships to the New England Municipal Clerks Institute.
